

***John says: "The Kingdom of God is at hand.  
Repent therefore and receive the EUANGGELIA!"***

The greek word, EUANGGELIA, used by the New Testament writers has been mystified and translated as "the Good News". The word EUANGGELIA is composed of three parts: EU, AGO, and AGELE. The word/particle EU means: "PROPER, ACCEPTABLE". The word/particle AGO means: "to LEAD". The word/particle AGELE is derived from the word AGO, and it means: "THAT which is LED (as a herd of sheep or cattle)". Prior to the days of the apostles, the word EUANGGELIA was not in common use. The commonly used word by the Greeks would have been the generic ANGGELIA which simply means: "to lead that which is being led; leading or guidance". But the apostles would have added the particle EU to the word ANGGELIA to mean: "PROPER leading or guidance".

The english word ANGEL comes from the greek word ANGGELO: "the person or mechanism of leading or guidance".

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
